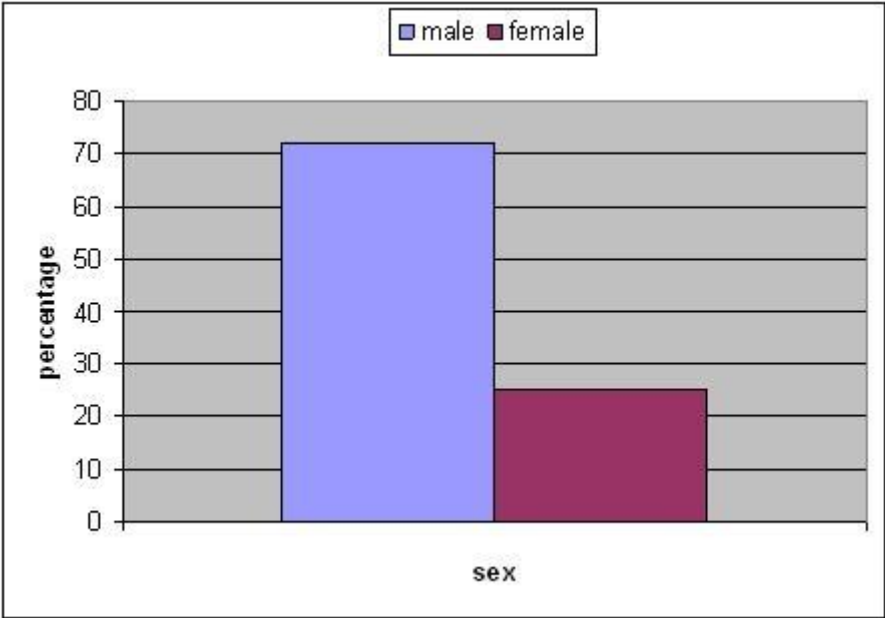

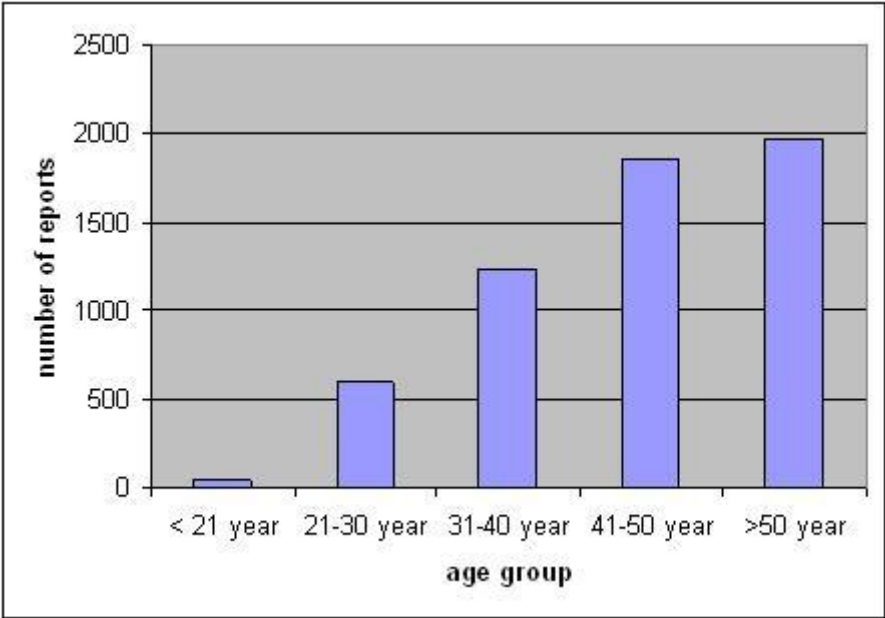

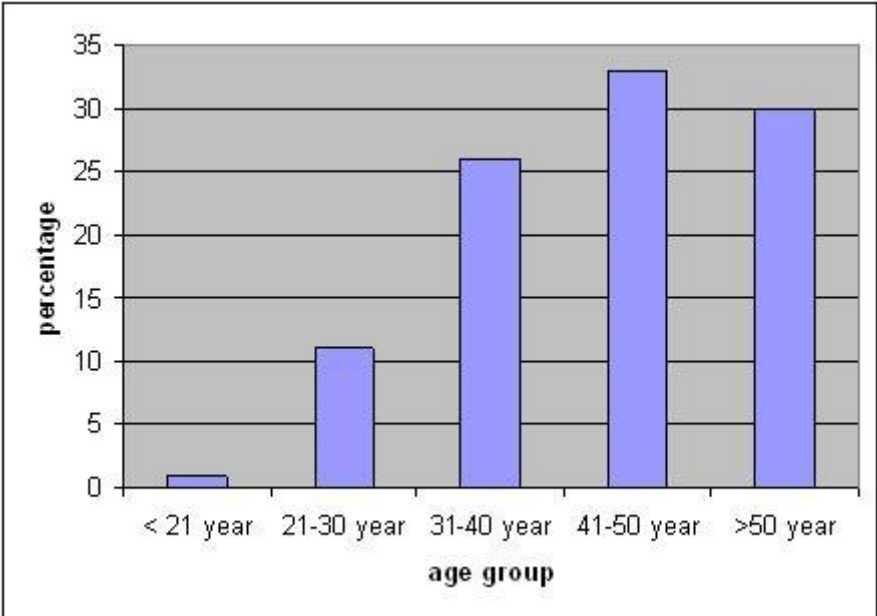

Disorders of posture and musculoskeletal system per age group in 2005

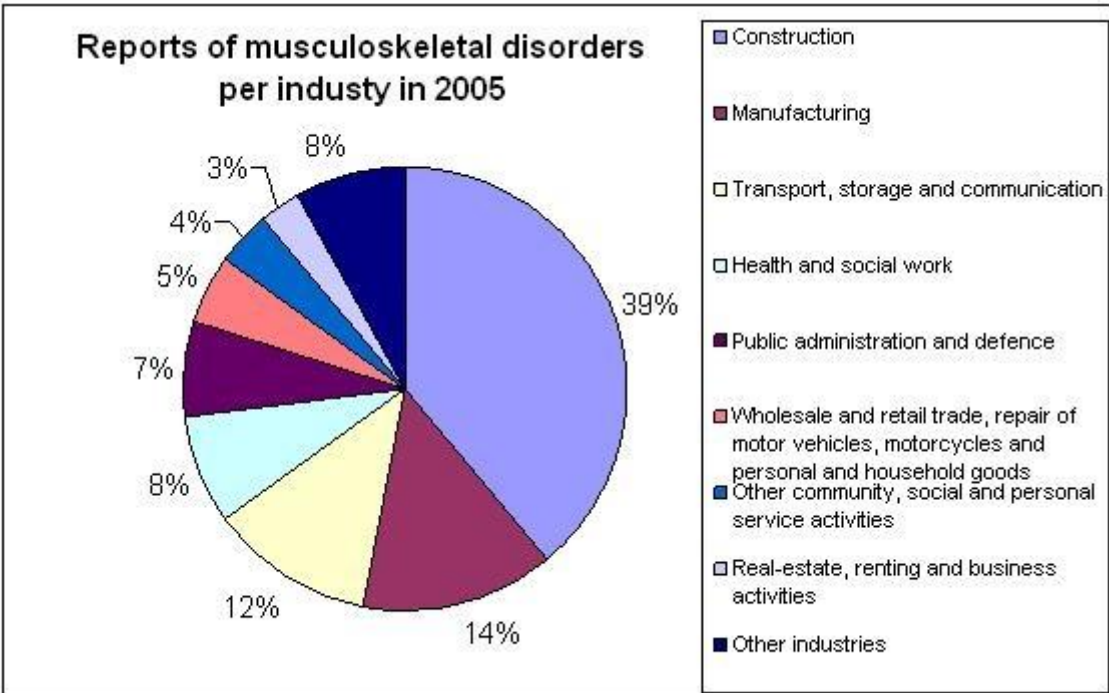
This figure shows the number of reports of disorders of posture and musculoskeletal system in the National Registry of Occupational Diseases per age group in 2005

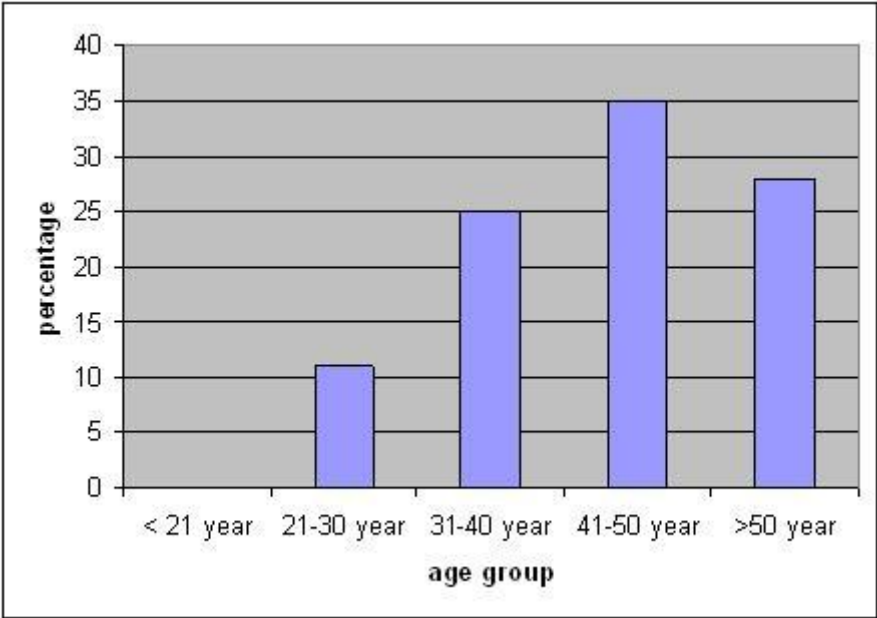

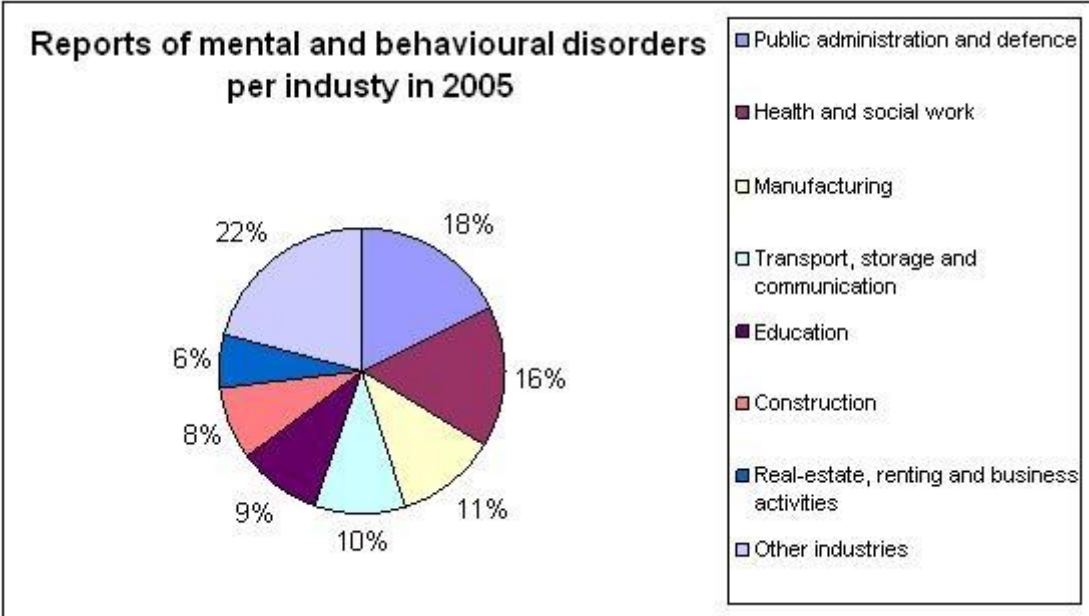
This figure shows the number of reports of psychological disorders in the National Registry of Occupational Diseases per age group in 2005

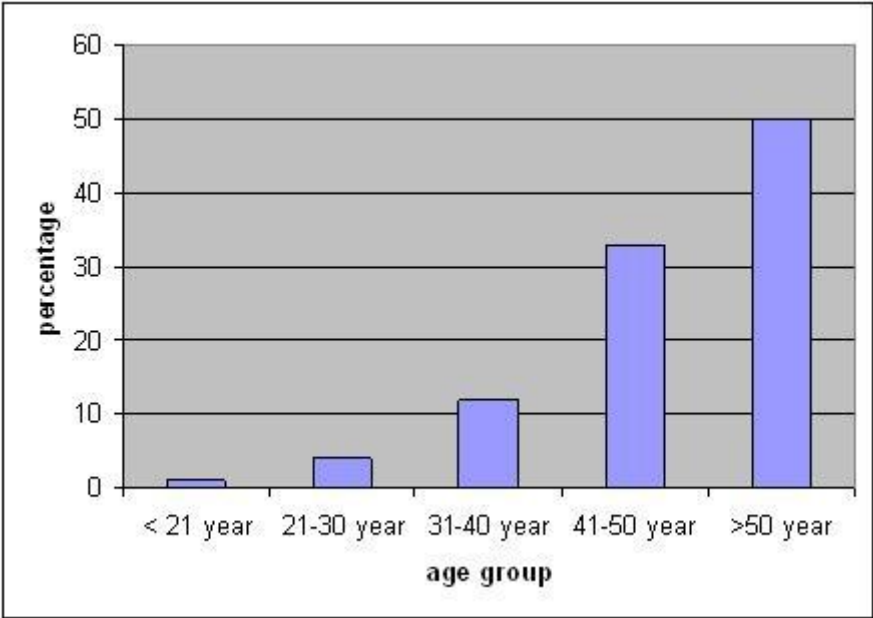

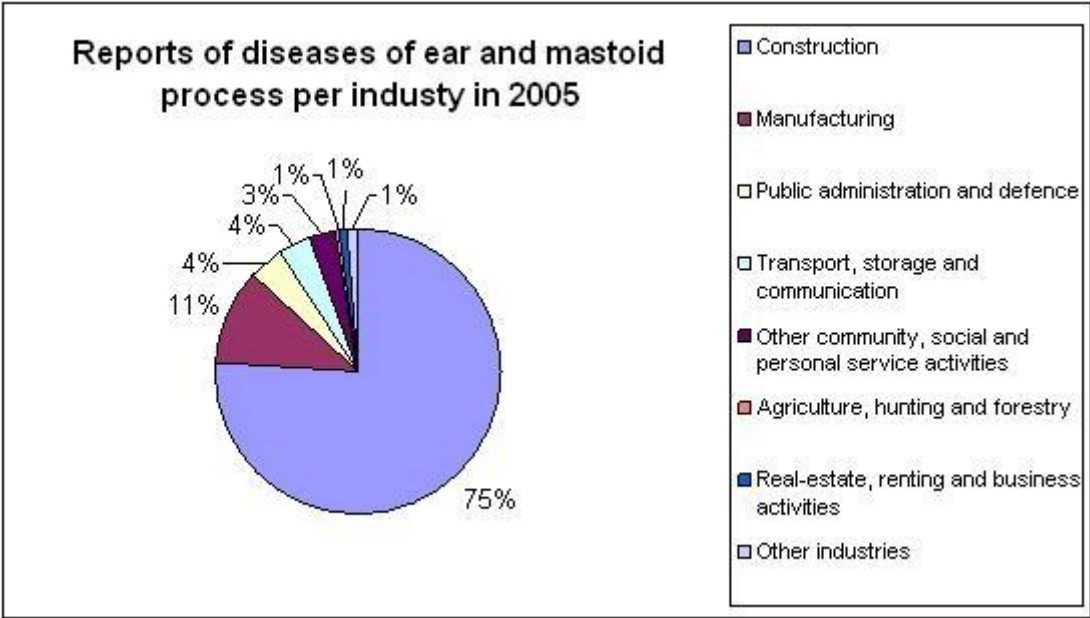
This figure shows the number of reports of diseases of the ear and mastoid process in the National Registry of Occupational Diseases per age group in 2005

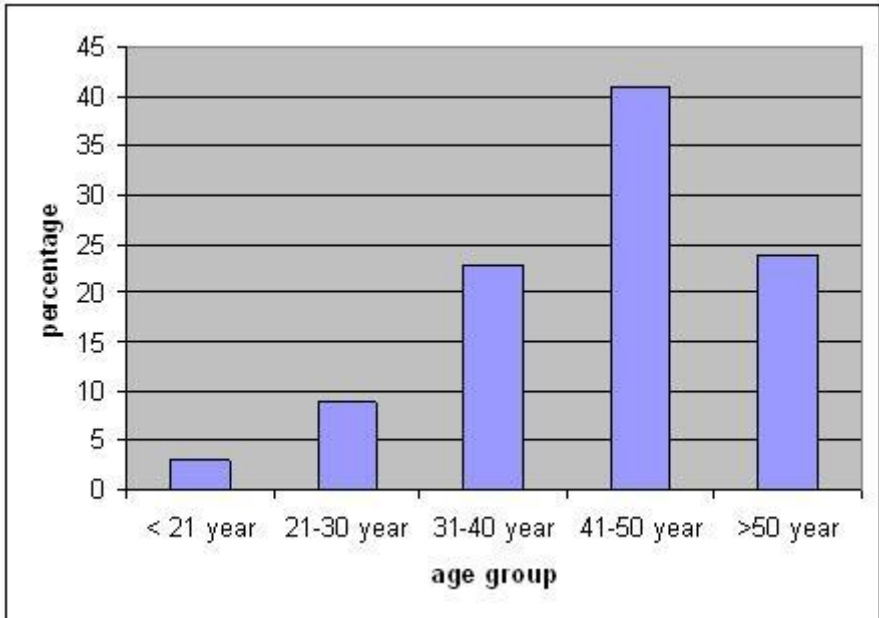

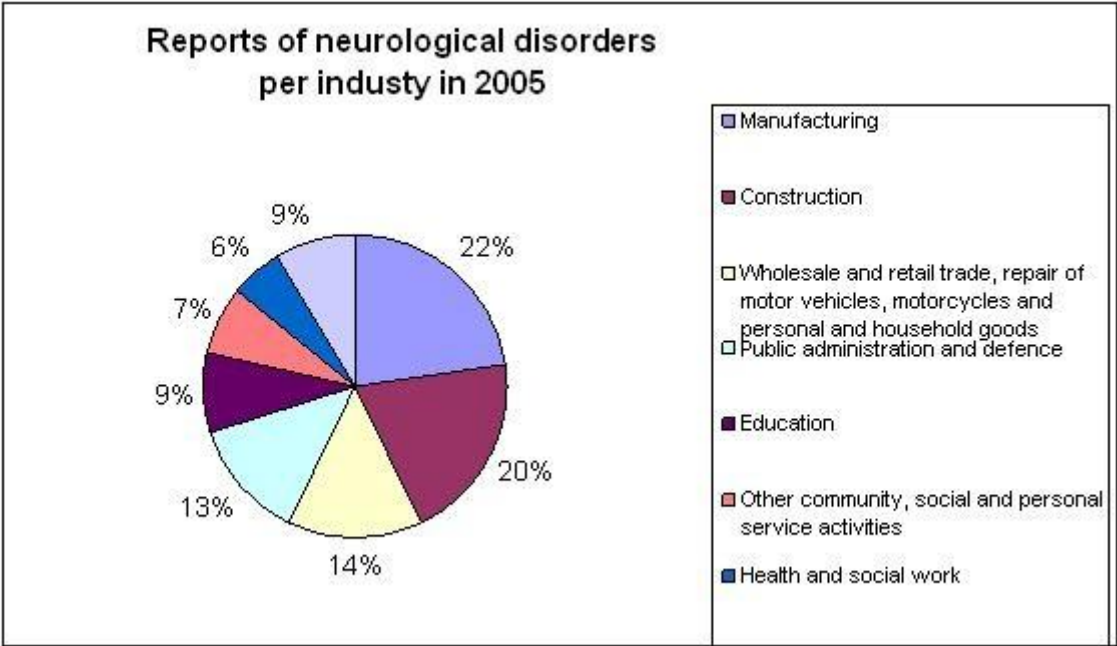
This figure shows the number of reports of neurological disorders in the National Registry of Occupational Diseases per age group in 2005

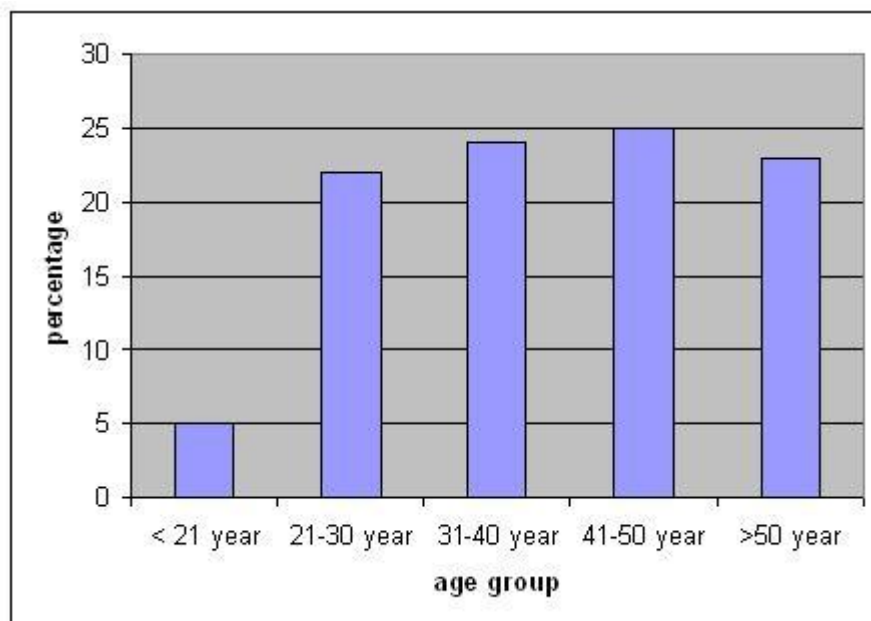

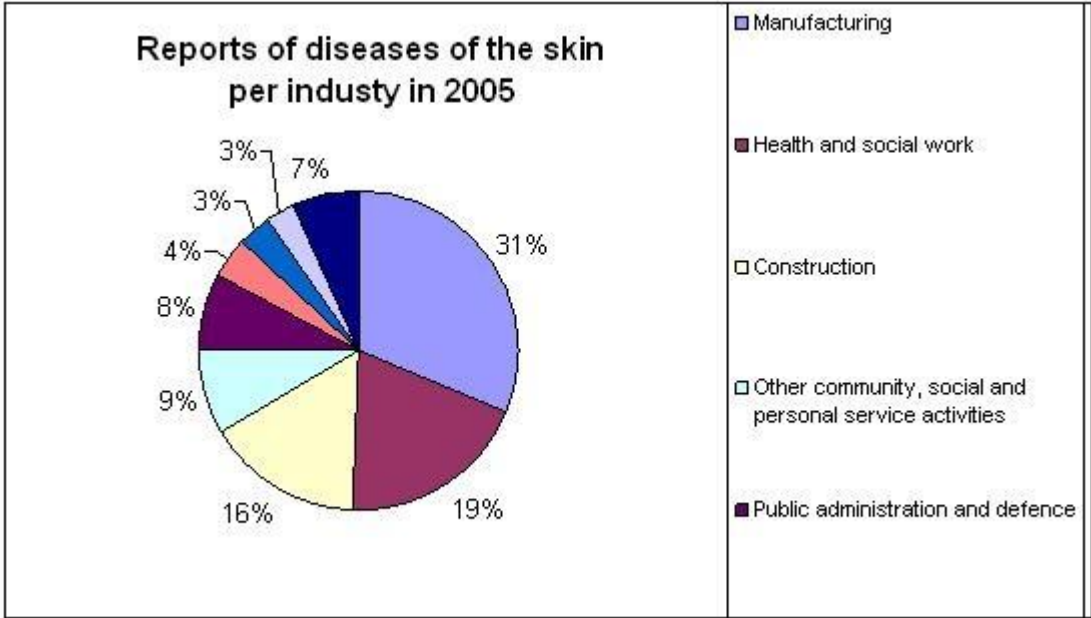
This figure shows the number of reports of skin disorders in the National Registry of Occupational Diseases per age group in 2005

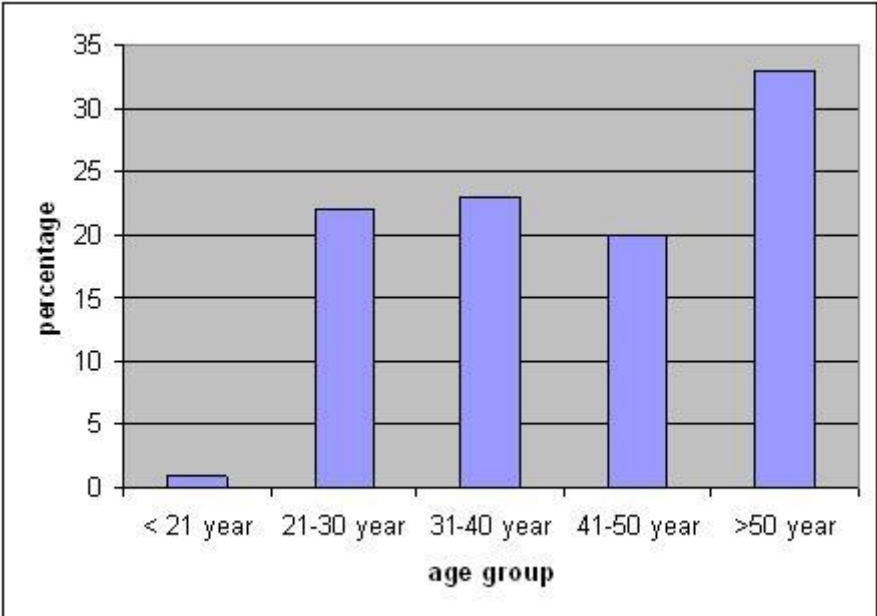

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Lung disorders per age group in 2005

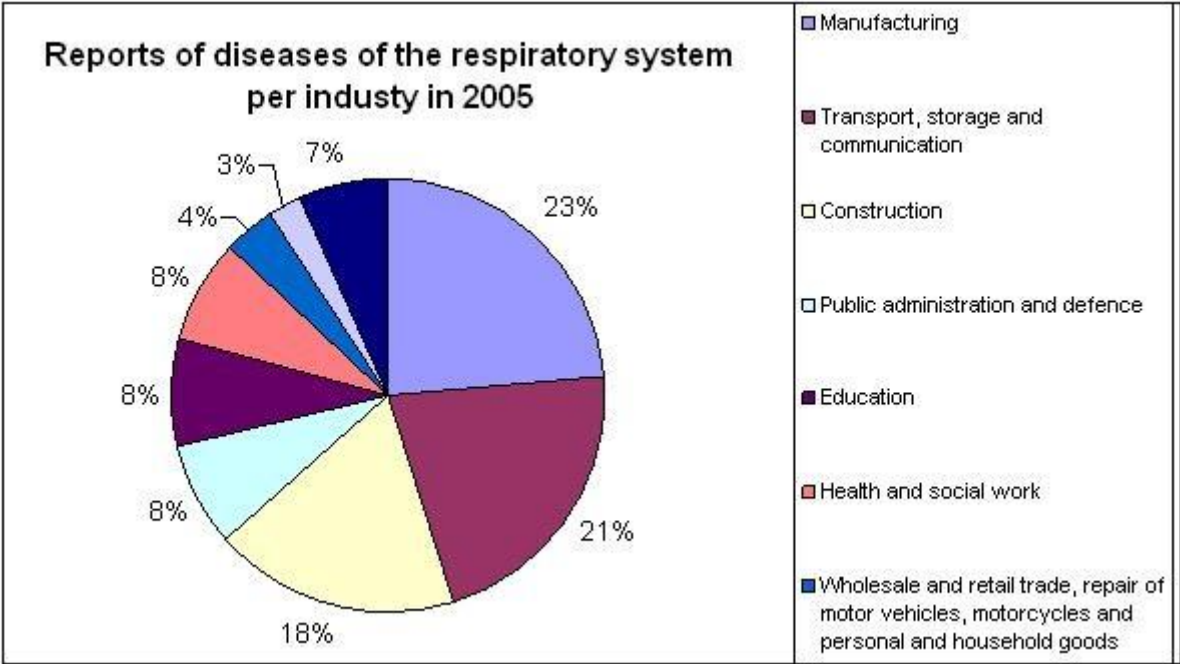
This figure shows the number of reports of lung disorders in the National Registry of Occupational Diseases per age group in 2005

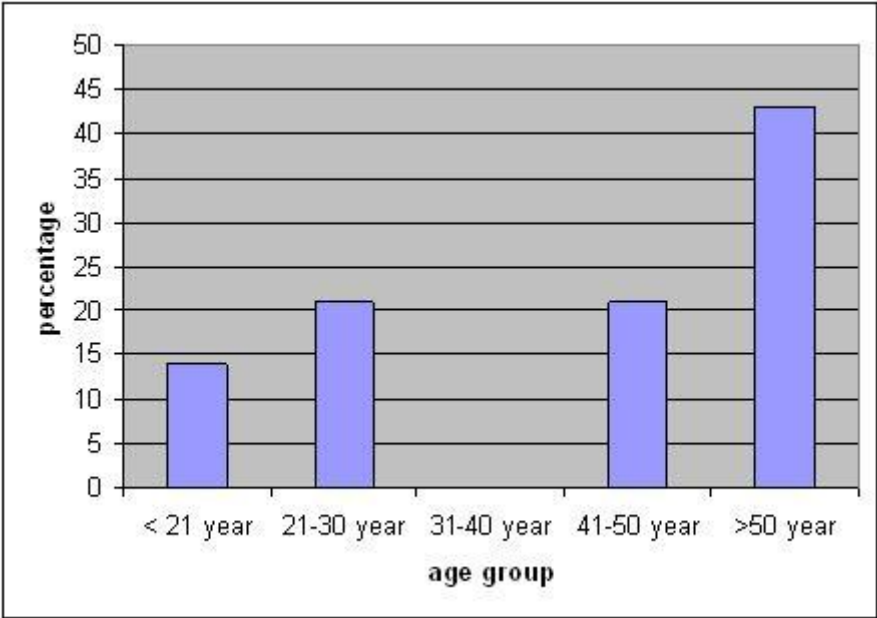

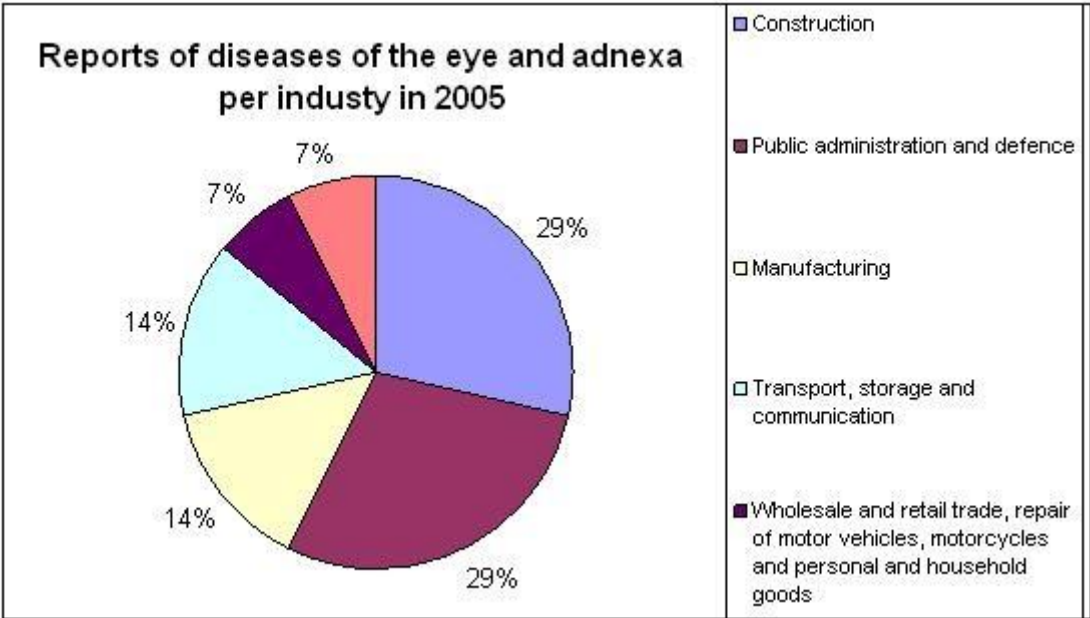
This figure shows the number of reports of diseases of eye and adnexa in the National Registry of Occupational Diseases per age group in 2005

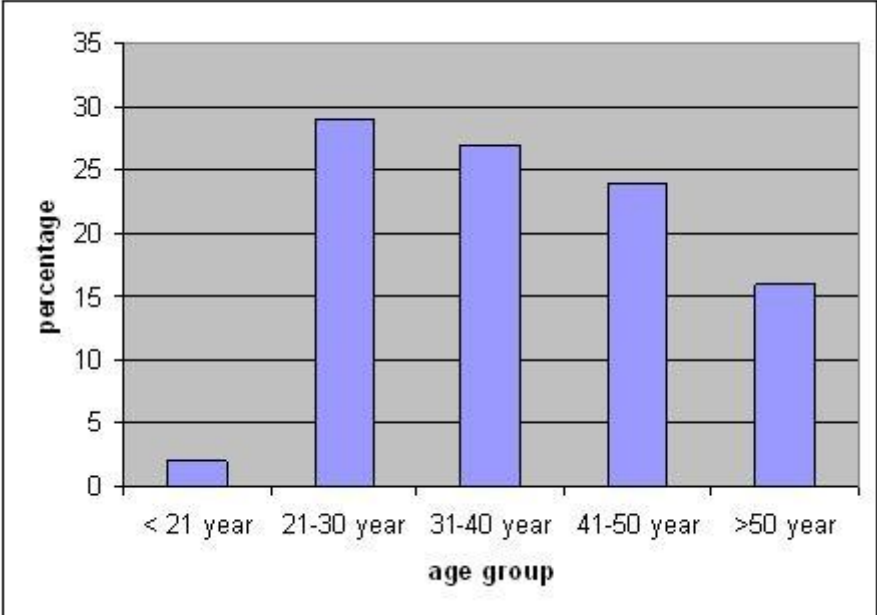

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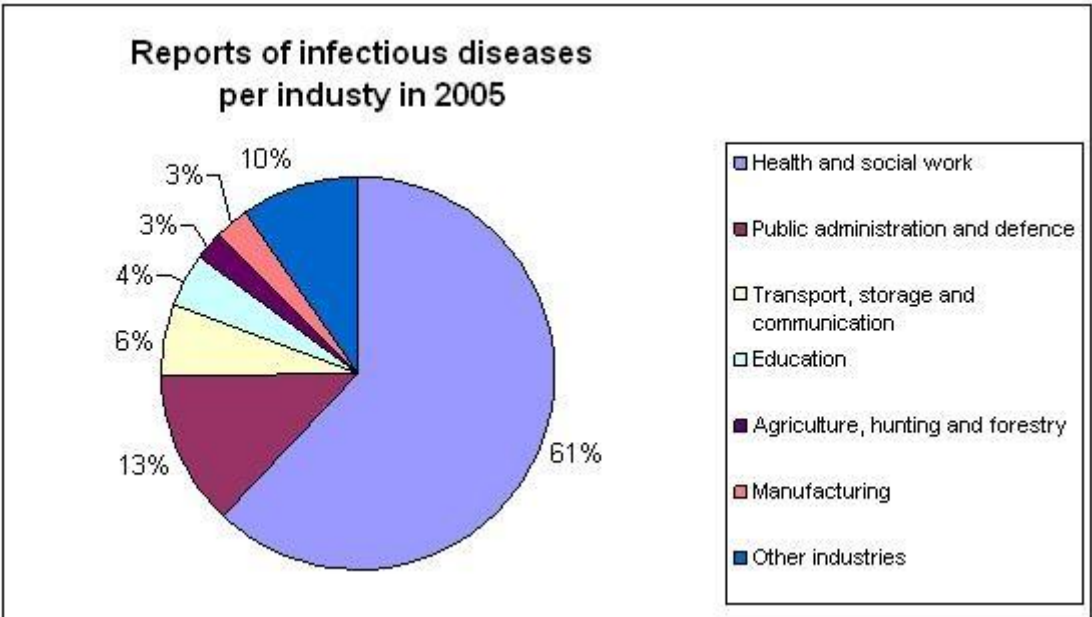
Infectious diseases per age group in 2005
